Shalom Center of the Interfaith Network of Kenosha County fills a unique and vital role by responding to food, shelter and support-service needs of the homeless and low-income population.

A private non-profit 501(c)(3) social service organization incorporated in 1984, Shalom Center partners with faith organizations, volunteers, businesses, schools, non-profit and civic groups, governmental agencies and others. A Board of Directors governs the Shalom Center and is responsible for establishing and upholding the agency's mission, setting policies and providing general governance.

The Shalom executive director leads the organization and is responsible for its general operations, community and charitable outreach and program development.

The mission of the Shalom Center is to respectfully provide food, shelter, housing and guidance to those in need. The following breaks out our major services and their impact:

Shalom's first soup-kitchen meal was served March 26, 1983. Approximately 1.5 million meals have been served on a daily basis since then. **In 2014, the soup kitchen served 31,284 meals.**

The food pantry opened at 8043 Sheridan Road, Kenosha, in November 2009. On average the pantry provides about 125,000 pounds of food for more than 1,000 families monthly. **In 2014, the food pantry distributed 1,474,523 pounds of food.**

The Emergency Shelter program started in April 1990 and houses up to eight families at a time at the center, 1713 62nd Street, Kenosha. **In 2014, the shelter program served 720 individuals, of whom 211 were children.**

The INNS program, launched in October 1991, consists of a number of shelters rotated between participating church sites. This program has continued daily for more than 23 years. **In 2014, 16,969 shelter nights were provided to those experiencing homelessness.**
